The brothers also made tremendous contributions to the school as well as to the greater community.

At ISC-Cairo, Aziz and Rashid developed a great passion for current affairs; a strong belief in, and a deep concern for, their fellow man. They became champions of the less fortunate in society, particularly those who are hungry and the victims of political and military conflict. Through Student Life, Aziz was able to turn his passion for human rights into concrete action. He frequently organized visits to local nursing homes, orphanages, and children's hospitals.

Rashid Kosber became active in SLO® in Grade 5. Like his brother, Rashid used his involvement in SLO® as a platform to make a difference in the world around him. Rashid actively organized numerous community outreach programs in addition to environmental projects to plant trees, care for the environment, and build a much needed wall around one of the local schools. In 10th grade he also worked directly with the Egyptian Ministry for the Family, now the National Council of Childhood and Motherhood, and was chosen to go as an observer with the Egyptian delegation to the 57th Convention on the Rights of the Child session at The United Nations in New York, where he had the chance to listen to experts on children's rights from all around the world.

Aziz graduated from ISC-Cairo in 2008 and went on to complete a 4-year degree in biology at Boston College in the U.S. Toward the end of his degree, Aziz was offered a job as a research assistant in a laboratory investigating malaria at the Harvard School of Public Health. He is now studying for the MCAT exam to apply to medical school. Rashid graduated from ISC-Cairo in June 2012 and plans to study economics before continuing on to medical school. Whatever their future holds, Aziz and Rashid Kosber are both sure to bring their determination to make a difference to all their future pursuits.
